

**MSCP ASSESSMENT REPORT

Assessment of the program student learning outcomes for the MSCP program occurs annually. The multiple choice comprehensive exams (core=125 items and emphasis= 50 items) are administered between the Winter and Spring terms. Assessment, by site supervisors using a form with a Likert Scale format, of the clinical experience occurs during the Fall, Winter and Spring terms. The Exit Interview (Likert Scale format) occurs during the Spring term. All evidence resulting from the analysis of these primary assessment tools and other assessment tools can be found at the CUH WASC RE-Accreditation site under the MSCP evidence link.

**2009-2010**

The School Counseling emphasis received full approval, without any conditions, from the Hawaii Teacher Standards Board. This external body approved the School Counseling emphasis through December 31, 2016. As annual assessment has not yet occurred or in the case of the Fall site supervisor's evaluation, the data has not been input, there are no results to report.

**2008-2009**

Core comprehensive exam was expanded from 105 items to 125 items. This expansion added 10 items from the required course Health, Stress Management and Counseling (PSY 751) and the required course Introduction to Counseling Skills (Psy 603). Previous internal and external assessment had indicated that these courses needed to be woven into the required core curriculum. The addition of these items at this point in time occurred because all of the students who were in the program when these courses became required (Psy751: Summer 2005 and Psy 603: Spring 2003) had now graduated and the faculty was able to generate the items and link them to program student learning outcomes. All students being assessed, during this school year, had entered the program with these courses as a requirement. An initial trend analysis of the outcomes of the 20 extra items will occur after the 2009-2010 administration of the core comprehensive exam. Overall results reinforce perception students are being trained adequately in counseling.

**2007-2008**

Core comprehensive exam was expanded from 100 items to 105 items. This expansion added 5 items assessing knowledge of Marianist Educational Values. The addition of these items allows the program to assess the link between the program and the CUH Mission. An initial trend analysis of the outcomes of the 5 Marianist Educational Values items will occur after the 2009-2010 administration of the core comprehensive exam. Overall results reinforce perception students are being trained adequately in counseling.

**2006-2007**

No program changes. Overall results reinforce perception students are being trained adequately in counseling.
